Petrykivka Painting Workshop

Halyna Nazarenko, from Petrykivka, Ukraine, is a master artist who has been painting in this style since her childhood. She is now considered to be one of the best artists working in Ukrainian decorative painting.

In this workshop you will create your own Petrykivka art, suitable for framing.

Supply List for Workshop:

- Gouache paints: Yellow, Green & Red
- Watercolor paper for thick drawing/sketching (size 9"x12")
- White paper (i.e. copy paper) for the sketch transfer (size 8.5"x11")
- Pencil with an eraser
- Paint Brushes
 - o No. 2 & No. 3, round
 - o No.1, fine tip
- Q-tips
- Paint palette (or you can use a plate, or something non-porous to mix your paints on)
- Palette knife to mix paints (or you can use the handle of a spoon or a plastic spoon, popsicle stick or a hard brush)
- Paper towels, wet & dry
- Container for water (i.e. cup, glass, jar, or clean can)
- Sketch page provided in this booklet (please print before the workshop)

About the Petrykivka Painting Style

The Petrykivka painting style originated from an ancient decorative art tradition in central Ukraine that was used for ornamenting whitewashed walls, ceiling beams, hearths, and household items. Petrykivka paintings are characterized by vivid colors and by flower, tree, and bird imagery that reflects the unity between humans and their natural environment and the cyclical rebirth of life.

In 2013, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) added the Petrykivka art form to its Representative List of the Intangible Cultural Heritage and Humanity.
